These values set the tone for the district as it relates to how we approach the work of educating our students and engaging our parents/guardians and other stakeholders. We want to interact with each other with all of these in mind. Operating with a sense of H-Pride will allow our parents to feel welcomed and engaged, and therefore experience a sense of belonging as we all work as a team on behalf of students.

Roundtable visits are conducted at approximately 2-6 per week. The principal, a parent, teacher, student, and community member are invited by the principal to attend the meeting to answer two questions posed by Dr. Horton. 1) What is going well at your school? 2) What can the district do to better support your school so that students can have a better experience? During the visit panel members share their thoughts as it relates to the questions while Dr. Horton's team listen intently and note concerns for follow-up.

Stakeholders are encouraged to take advantage of the weekly ThoughtExchanges. It is an excellent way to provide ongoing feedback about various topics. The QR code and link can be found in the Superintendent's Weekly Newsletter and social media. The newsletter is sent by text, social media, and posted on the district's website.

During the months of October and November, several townhall meetings have been scheduled. These meetings provide a platform for open and transparent communication between community members and leaders. They are also scheduled to encourage active participation from the community, giving them a voice in decisions that directly affect them.

Finally, it's an excellent way for the District to disseminate important information for townhall discussions.

What are the plans to possibly increase parent engagement throughout the cluster?

Communication is a fundamental component of community engagement. Effective communication helps build trust, foster relationships, and ensure that all stakeholders are informed and involved in the decision-making process. It takes various forms in DCSD, including:

5. DCSD makes every effort to uplift the voices of all stakeholders. The newly launch Superintendent Parent Advisory Councils provide a way to discuss issues/concerns and problem solve in a small group with Superintendent Horton. After each advisory meeting, next steps will be developed in order to address issues on a given topic.

How is the Board assisting with the teacher shortage?

The Board of Education has done a phenomenal job supporting the District in this age and era of teacher shortages.

First, rewarding the teachers who were retained by providing a \$2,000 retention payment on October 6, 2023. Approving a 6% cost of living adjustment and step increase for all new and existing teachers. Approving a \$3,000-\$4000 new teacher incentive for every new teacher hired by October 1, 2023.

Approving the IGNITE DeKalb Teacher Residency Program which is scheduled to launch in January 2024 and will yield 150 new teachers by December 2025.

We are grateful for the Board of Education leadership and support.

How can we get more students to come more and help the community together?

- Getting students involved in the community is a valuable way to promote civic engagement, foster a sense of responsibility, and build important life skills.
- Student leadership opportunities such as the Superintendent Student Advisory Council.
