## 2024 CCRPI Scores Reveal Significant Growth in Closing Achievement Gaps at DCSD Elementary and High School Levels

(STONE MOUNTAIN, GA) –The 2024 College and Career Ready Performance Index (*CCRPI*) scores show that DeKalb County School District (*DCSD*) elementary schools earned a perfect score of 100 in the Closing Gaps component, matching the state average. District high schools outperformed the state significantly, finishing just five points shy of 100. DCSD also exceeded the state average in the Progress category at the elementary and middle school levels.

"These latest CCRPI assessment results highlight both growth and opportunity," said DCSD Superintendent Dr. Devon Q. Horton. "We believe every student deserves the opportunity to master content at or above their grade level, and it's our responsibility to provide them with the necessary tools. By doing so, we will continue raising our graduation rates and creating futures that reflect the excellence and achievement we strive for every day."

The following tables display the CCRPI district-level scores for each component for 2023 and 2024. At the elementary school level, DCSD showed improvements in two out of three CCRPI components (66.7%) compared to the previous year's scores. Additionally, DCSD made gains in three out of four

high school scores (75%). All three middle school scores also demonstrated improvement, resulting in a 100% increase.

The Content Mastery, Progress, Readiness, and Graduation Rate components are comparable between 2023 and 2024. However, the Closing Gaps component is not comparable between the two years because the 2024 component excludes mathematics scores.

## More specifically:

Six DCSD schools achieved a perfect score of 100.0 in **Content Mastery**, which assesses whether students are achieving the level of understanding necessary to be prepared for the next grade, college, or career. Additionally, fifteen schools scored 80.0 or higher.

Seven DCSD schools earned a maximum score of 100.0 in **Progress**, which evaluates students' growth compared to their academically similar peers. An additional 29 schools earned 90.0 or higher.

Thirty-five DCSD schools attained 100.0 maximum scores in **Closing Gaps**, which measures the improvement of all students and student subgroups in their achievement rates. An additional eight schools scored 90.0 or higher.

Two DCSD schools accomplished perfect 100.0 scores in **Readiness**, which measures whether students are participating in activities that prepare them for and demonstrate readiness for the next level, college, or career. An additional twenty-one schools earned 90.0 or higher.

One DCSD school achieved a perfect 100.0 score in the Graduation Rate, which assesses whether students graduate from high school with a regular diploma within four or five years. Additionally, sixteen other schools scored 75.0 or higher.
